



## WP2 LTPs Checklist for Authors:

- ✓ LTP Units follow a particular content focus (theme);
- ✓ LTPs Units have (1) activities description for in-service teachers and student teachers, (2) resources and support materials (practical to be used in the classroom), (3) curriculum connection (or whole school approach), (4) reference to GreenComp competence area(s), and (5) suggested assessment.
- ✓ The LTPS are aligned with the interconnected four competences defined in the Green Comp Framework;
- ✓ LTP activities offer a variety of learning, teaching and assessment approaches which **promote** participation, critical thinking, future thinking, collaboration, creativity, and reflective practice; and equip with **change-making mindset and skills** (see point 4 of the Roadmap 'Working through the design process')¹\*;
- ✓ LTP Units are created along the **architecture** and use all **the same structure** (#01 Start-Up, #02 Development, #03 Consolidation, #04 Follow-Up);
- ✓ LTP Units build on each other and fit together (but in principle also function as separate parts).

## \*LTP activities and content aims to engage in-service teachers and pre-service teachers in:

- ✓ in **reflecting** and articulating their own sustainability values, knowledge, practices and priorities in ways which are meaningful to them;
- ✓ in identifying their/their school's current strengths and priorities for further development;
- ✓ in co-creating and adapting materials for their contexts;
- ✓ with ongoing self and collaborative reflection and professional learning;,
- ✓ in **networking** with colleagues and partner institutions regionally and locally;
- ✓ in **practicing practical perspective**, raising questions, and discussing possible solutions.

## **Technical Points:**

- ✓ LTP template (general description and detailed units description) is fully filled in in due time;
- ✓ All the created materials are with <u>TAP-TS logo and disclaimer</u>.
- ✓ Developed presentations use the TAP-TS presentation template.
- ✓ All external resources are used with alignment to **copyright**.
- ✓ All LTP materials are meant to be open education resources.
- ✓ Any attached resources should be easily accessible, for this purpose LTP materials should of standardized data format (e.g.: .pdf; .doc, .mp3, .jpg, mp4).
